**Gallery One: Assembly**

**12 April - 11 May, 2012**

Assembly is a conceptual proposition that asks its participants to consider the following questions: who is able to speak freely and fearlessly? About what topics is it important to speak? From what moral, ethical or spiritual position does one speak? What are the consequences of speaking frankly? How does this relate to the exercise of power? These questions, posed by Michel Foucault in 1983, will be addressed over three weeks through architectural interventions, intimate and public events, happenings, performances, discussions, screenings, pamphlets and the internet.

Alongside Assembly and complementing, even overlapping it, will be a project in Gallery Two by the collective Local Time.
